Hebrews 7:23–28 , ²⁴ but he holds his priesthood **permanently**, because he continues forever.

13.61 ἀπαράβατος, ον; ἀμετάθετος, ον: pertaining to that which does not change from one state to another—'not changing, unchanging, never to change.'

ἀπαράβατος: ὁ δὲ διὰ τὸ μένειν αὐτὸν εἰς τὸν αἰῶνα ἀπαράβατον ἔχει τὴν ἱερωσύνην 'and because he lives forever, his priesthood never changes' <u>He</u> 7:24.

ἀμετάθετος: ἐπιδεῖξαι τοῖς κληρονόμοις τῆς ἐπαγγελίας τὸ ἀμετάθετον τῆς βουλῆς αὐτοῦ 'to show those who were to receive what he has promised that his plan is unchanging' or '… never changes' He 6:17

Hebrews 7:26

Hebrews 7:26 For it was indeed fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, innocent, unstained, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens.

Ephesians 1:19 and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might

Ephesians 1:20 that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places.

Ephesians 1:21 far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.

Ephesians 1:22 And he put all things under his feet and gave him as head over all things to the church, Ephesians 1:23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Philippians 2:7 but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.

Philippians 2:8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Philippians 2:9 Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name,

<u>Philippians 2:10</u> so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

Philippians 2:11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Hebrews 6:17 So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath,

Hebrews 6:18 so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us.

<u>Hebrews 6:19</u> We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain,

<u>Hebrews 6:20</u> where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek.

Hebrews 8:1-2 one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven

Mark 16:19 So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God.

<u>Luke 22:69</u> But from now on the Son of Man shall be seated at the right hand of the power of God."

⁵⁶ And he said, "Behold, I see qthe heavens opened, and rthe Son of Man standing pat the right hand of God."

Hebrews 8:2 a minister in the holy places, in the true tent that the Lord set up, not man.

Hebrews 9:11 But when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things that have come, then through the greater and more perfect tent (not made with hands, that is, not of this creation)

<u>Hebrews 9:23</u> Thus it was necessary for the copies of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. <u>Hebrews 9:24</u> For Christ has entered, not into holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true things, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.

Hebrews 8:3 For every high priest is appointed to offer gifts and sacrifices; thus it is

necessary for this priest also to have something to offer.

<u>Hebrews 13:12</u> So **Jesus** also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood.

<u>Hebrews 13:13</u> Therefore let us go to him outside the camp and bear the reproach he endured.

Hebrews 13:14 For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come.

Hebrews 13:15 Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name.

Hebrews 13:16 Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.
