Time Time Time

1 Peter 1:3–21 (NKJV)

3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,

4 to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, **reserved in heaven** for you,

5 who are kept by the power of God through faith for **salvation ready to be**

revealed in the last Time

6 In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials,

7 that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory **at the revelation of Jesus Christ.**

8 Whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory,

9 **receiving the end of your faith—the salvation of your souls.**

10 Of this salvation the prophets have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you,

11 searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and **the glories that would follow.**

12 To them it was revealed that, not to themselves, but to us they were ministering the things which now have been reported to you through those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven—

things which angels desire to look into

13 Therefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and **rest your hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ;**

14 as obedient children, not conforming yourselves to the former lusts, as in your ignorance;

15 but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy **in all your conduct**

16 because it is written, "Be holy, for I am holy."

17 And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work,

conduct yourselves throughout the Time of your stay here in fear.

18 knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers,

19 but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot.

20 He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifested in these last times for you

21 who through Him believe in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.

Yet in the future

Living with such persuasion, as if it's already been obtained

Why would man having never seen the crown deny himself of everything that he has known for an eternal promise

Universal statement, includes everything we do

Rewards at the judgment seat of Christ

With the highest regard for what is written

How do we Spend Time?

When we spend something we **exchange** one thing for something else. We give something up to receive something else. It's an exchange!!

However we choose to **Spend Time**, we are **exchanging** something of lesser value for something of greater value.

No price can be given for you eternal life, or our justification is completely free.

But Christ came not just to give us eternal life, but he came to give us also **the abundant life**. For the abundant life, we have to be willing to **exchange** that which is temporal, for that which is eternal. The word of God. God's directions in his word all have eternal ramifications.

God is our designer, He tells us how we are to operate, so that we can have the best possible results in the age in which we are living; with the end result being an eternal reward at the judgment seat of Christ

Not only does Christ teach time is short for each individual,

1 Peter 1:24–25 (NKJV)

24 because "All flesh is as grass, And all the glory of man as the flower of the grass. The grass withers, And its flower falls away,

25 But the word of the Lord endures forever.

But he also teaches us that time could be cut even shorter; he could return at any moment!!

The abundant life is: an ever increasing capacity to appreciate God. It's a life filled with zealous obedience to doctrine ever mindful of our reward at the judgment seat of Christ

The illustration of the athlete, is to give us the picture that we are not only in preparation for, but also competing for something of exceeding great value; so much so that we are willing to give up all the things of this life to obtain that exceeding great prize; which we will receive at the judgment seat of Christ.

It doesn't matter how much we have invested to obtain what we desire in this life, cast it all aside for something far far greater. Cast it all aside, treat all these so-called precious things in this life with disdain; not as cat rocks in the litter box, or as gourmet vomit.

But alas it's a matter of volition. What is your preferred desire; and what system will you employ to obtain that desire?

Each day is another opportunity to make that choice, we're going to make it right now and we're going to make it again this evening. Every time we give thought to it we make a choice.

God is relentless. God never stops giving opportunity to the children of Israel. Every moment, every time we give thought, we have another opportunity to choose that system of thought that will best suit the conclusion that we prefer to arrive at

The purpose of the church is to make disciples. A disciple is one who has set their determination to learn and obey God's word over everything else.

Before the fall, the human spirit was united with the Holy Spirit, making the word of God (which is the source of life) able to be assimilated, energizing the spiritual man !!

When Adam fell in his rebellion against doctrine, he not only lost the human spirit (which means, he died spiritually) and fellowship with the Holy Spirit, he also lost the energy source for eternal life, which is **the word of God**.

Man lost a vital component necessary to function as a human; the human spirit,

John 3:5–6 (NKJV)

5 Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.

6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

That which is born of the Spirit of God is a spirit of man
