1 Peter 1:13-15 (NKJV)

13 Therefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and rest your hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ;
14 as obedient children, not conforming yourselves to the former lusts, as in your ignorance;

15 but as He who called you is holy, **you also be holy in all your conduct**

1 Peter 4:7 (NKJV)

7 But the end of all things is at hand; therefore be serious and watchful in your prayers.

34 "But take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and cares of this life, and that Day come on you unexpectedly.

Romans 13:11-13 (NKJV)

11 And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we first believed.
12 The night is far spent, the day is at hand. Therefore let us cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light.
13 Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy.

1 Thessalonians 5:6-8 (NKJV)

6 Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober.
7 For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night.
8 But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation.

Though Christ did not have a sin nature, Satan attempted to influence Him nonetheless

Luke 4:3-12 (NKJV)

3 And the devil said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread."
4 But Jesus answered him, saying, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.'"
5 Then the devil, taking Him up on a high mountain, showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time.
6 And the devil said to Him, "All this authority I will give You, and their glory; for this has been delivered to me, and I give it to whomsoever I wish.
7 Therefore, if You will worship before me, all will be Yours."
8 And Jesus answered and said to him, "Get behind Me, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only you shall serve.'"
9 Then he brought Him to Jerusalem, set Him on the pinnacle of the temple, and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down from here.
10 For it is written: 'He shall give His angels charge over you, to keep you.'
11 and, 'In their hands they shall bear you up, Lest you dash your foot against a stone.'"
12 And Jesus answered and said to him, "It has been said, 'You shall not tempt the Lord your God.'"

Satan great accuser:

Zechariah 3:1-2 (NKJV)

1 Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of the Lord, and **Satan standing at his right hand to oppose him**.
2 And the Lord said to Satan, "The Lord rebuke you, Satan! The Lord who has chosen Jerusalem rebuke you! Is this not a brand plucked from the fire?"

Job 1:9-12 (NKJV)

9 So **Satan** answered the Lord and said, "Does Job fear God for nothing?"
10 Have You not made a hedge around him, around his household, and around all that he has on every side? You have blessed the work of his hands, and his possessions have increased in the land.
11 **But now, stretch out Your hand and touch all that he has, and he will surely curse You to Your face!"**
12 And the Lord said to **Satan**, "Behold, all that he has is in your power; only do not lay a hand on his person." So **Satan** went out from the presence of the Lord.

b.

God uses temptations testings and trials to perfect us:

1 Peter 5:5-11 (NKJV)

5 Likewise you younger people, submit yourselves to your elders. Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be clothed with humility, for "God resists the proud, But gives grace to the humble."
6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time,
7 casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you.
8 Be sober, be vigilant, because **your adversary the devil** walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom **he may devour**.
9 Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world.
10 **But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you.**
11 To Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Ephesians 6:10-18 (NKJV)

10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might.
11 **Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.**
12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against **the rulers of the darkness of this age**, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.

14 Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness,
