 - worthy (comparable/characterized by the Holy Spirit)
 - Philippians 1:27 (NKJV)
 - 27 Only let your **conduct be worthy** of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of your affairs, that you stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel,
 - 1 Thessalonians 2:12 (NKJV)
 - 12 that you would walk worthy of God who calls you into His own kingdom and glory.
 - LN greek/English Lexicon: pertaining to having a relatively high degree of comparable merit or worth—'worthy, comparable, of comparable value, worthily.'

 - Ephesians 4:1-6 (NKJV)
 - I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called, 2
 with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, 3 endeavoring to keep the unity of

the Spirit in the bond of peace. 4 There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; 5 one Lord, one faith, one baptism; 6 one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all.

- pleasing :satisfaction the trait of delightfully yielding to the will of another person for their happiness.
- being fruitful:to produce consequences bear fruit- to produce actions and natural consequences befitting one's nature; conceived of as a tree bearing fruit according to its kind.
- knowledge ἐπί-γνωσις, -εως, ἡ, (ἐπιγινώσχω, g. v. [cf. also Bp. Lghtft. on Col. 1:9; Trench § lxxv. ad fin.]), precise and correct knowledge; used in the N. - patience: stedfast endurance the power to withstand hardship or stress; especially the inward fortitude necessary.
- longsuffering: a state of emotional calm in the face of provocation or misfortune and without complaint of irritation

longsuffering μακροθυμία, -ας, ἡ, (μακρόθυμος [cf. μακροθυμέω]), (Vulg. longanimitas, etc.), i.e.

1. patience, endurance, constancy, steadfastness, perseverance; esp. as shown in bearing troubles and ills, (Plut. Luc. 32 sq.; ἄνθρωπος ὢν μηδέποτε τὴν ἀλυπίαν αἰτοῦ παρὰ θεῶν, ἀλλὰ μακροθυμίαν, Menand. frag. 19, p. 203 ed. Meineke [vol. 4. p. 238 Frag, comic. Grace. 2. patience, forbearance, **long-suffering, slowness in avenging wrongs**, (for אָרֶךְ אַפַּיִם, Jer. 15:15): Ro. 2:4; 9:22; 2 Co. 6:6; Gal. 5:22; Eph. 4:2; Col. 3:12; 1 Tim. 1:16 [cf. B. 120 (105)]; 2 Tim. 4:2; 1 Pet. 3:20; 2 Pet. 3:15; (Clem. Rom. 1 Cor. 13, 1; Ignat. ad Eph. 3, 1).*

[Syn. μακροθυμία, ὑπομονή (occur together or in the same context in Col. 1:11; 2 Cor. 6:4, 6; 2 Tim. 3:10; Jas. 5:10, 11; cf. Clem. Rom. 1 Cor. 64; Ignat. ad Eph. 3, 1): Bp. Lghtft. remarks (on Col. I. c.), "The difference of meaning is best seen in their opposites.

While ὑπο. is the temper which does not easily succumb under suffering, μαπ. is the self-restraint which does not hastily retaliate a wrong.

The one is opposed to cowardice or despondency, the other to wrath or revenge (Prov. 15:18; 16:32) ... **This distinction, though it applies generally, is not true without exception**" ...; cf. also his note on Col. 3:12, and see (more at length) Trench, N. T. Syn. § liii

The power of God is for living like Christ in character. Because we have the whole word of God and the mystery of the gospel has been revealed our efforts are applied to living soberly, righteously and godly, free from the carnal mind.

Romans 8:5-8 (NKJV)

- 5 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit.
- 6 For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.
- 7 Because the carnal mind is enmity against God; for it is not subject to the law of God, nor indeed can be.
- 8 So then, those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

Romans 8:12-17 (NKJV)

- 12 Therefore, brethren, we are debtors—not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh.
- 13 For if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.
- 14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God.
- 15 For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father."
- 16 The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God,
- 17 and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together.

We might not need to pray for patience/longsuffering but we can pray for and expect to receive the power of God for godly living.
